

Land Clearing

Before any foundation can be laid, the site must be cleared of trees, brush, rocks, and debris.

f In Kingston's rural zones like South Frontenac or Amherstview, large lot sizes often require mechanical clearing with heavy equipment. Local bylaws may also require tree preservation plans.

Grading and Leveling

The ground is reshaped to ensure proper drainage and a level building pad.

© Sloped lots near Lake Ontario or Cataraqui North often require soil stabilization and engineered retaining walls to prevent erosion or water damage during spring thaw.

✓ Foundation Installation

Your prefab home will typically be placed on a concrete basement or crawl space foundation.

• Due to Kingston's deep frost line, foundations must be dug below the frost depth (typically 4 ft+), which impacts excavation and insulation requirements.

Utility Connections

Water, sewer/septic, hydro, and internet are all installed during this stage.

In rural builds outside Kingston proper, trenching for septic systems and hydro poles may add time and cost. City builds may require service permits from Utilities Kingston and ESA inspections.
